Auto Accident Check List

1. Write down the license plate number of other vehicle along with the make and model of the vehicle.
2. Obtain the driver's license number of other driver;
3. Obtain the insurance information of other vehicle. (Policy Number, Insurance Company and Agent, if possible);
4. Obtain the phone number of other driver;
5. Call the police and ask for a police report;
6. Don't move the vehicles, UNLESS it would be dangerous to leave the vehicles in that location;
7. Write down names of all persons in all vehicles involved in the accident;
8. Write down your initial injuries, if any;
9. Write down any injuries, which other persons in the involved vehicles suffered.
10. After the accident, be sure to keep a log of your injuries, pain or discomfort. Many injuries do not manifest themselves until much later.
11. Review your automobile insurance policy and determine whether you have the tort threshold, which permits or denies you from filing a claim for bodily injury claims. You should contact your attorney to review the policy with you.
